3 "(c) FUNDING FOR CERTAIN ENHANCED CAPABILI-4 TIES.—In each of fiscal years 2020 and 2021, the Com-5 mandant may provide additional funding for the land-6 based unmanned aircraft system program in amounts, and 7 for purposes, as follows:

8 "(1) \$2,000,000 in each fiscal year for assess9 ment of the expanded use of medium range un10 manned aircraft systems within the program.

14 (b) REPORT ON USE OF UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYS-15 TEMS FOR CERTAIN SURVEILLANCE.—

(1) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than March
31, 2021, the Commandant of the Coast Guard shall
submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a
report setting forth an assessment of the feasibility
and advisability of using unmanned aircraft systems
(UAS) for surveillance of marine protected areas,
the transit zone, and the Arctic in order to—
