A BILL

To require certain agencies to include a page on the website of the agency relating to permit applications, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Permitting Trans-
- 5 parency and Accountability Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PERMIT APPLICATION STATUS.
- 7 (a) Definitions.—In this section:

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1	(1) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
2	meaning given the term in section 551 of title 5,
3	United States Code.
4	(2) COVERED AGENCY.—The term "covered
5	agency" means an agency that issues permits.
6	(3) PERMIT.—The term "permit" has the
7	meaning given the term "license" in section 551 of
8	title 5, United States Code.
9	(4) Reviewing agency.—The term "reviewing
10	agency" means an agency that, with respect to a
11	permit—
12	(A) does not issue the permit; and
13	(B)(i) reviews the application for the per-
14	mit; or
15	(ii) engages in any step of the process re-
16	lating to the issuance of the permit.
17	(b) Requirement.—
18	(1) In General.—The head of each covered
19	agency shall include on the website of the covered
20	agency a webpage that displays information relating
21	to the status of an application for a permit issued
22	by the covered agency.
23	(2) Required information.—The informa-
24	tion included on a webpage developed under para-

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1	graph (1) shall include, with respect to an applica-
2	tion for a permit issued by a covered agency—
3	(A) a description of the stages completed
4	by the covered agency or any reviewing agency
5	in the application review process;
6	(B) the duration in number of days of each
7	stage described in subparagraph (A);
8	(C) the status of the application, including
9	the duration in number of days the application
10	has remained at the current stage of the appli-
11	cation review process;
12	(D) contact information for each individual
13	reviewing the application within the covered
14	agency or any reviewing agency;
15	(E) a description of the stages in the appli-
16	cation review process required to be completed
17	before the covered agency makes a determina-
18	tion with respect to the application; and
19	(F) an estimated timeline for a determina-
20	tion with respect to the application.
