2	Human Services, acting through the Commissioner of

5	actment of this Act, finalize such revisions to regula-
6	tions as may be necessary to implement the amend-
7	ments made by subsections (a) and (b); and
8	(2) ensure that such regulations are consistent
9	with any applicable international agreements.
